As a new hire, after completing your Intake appointment, you will receive a *Welcome to UC Merced* email at your ucmerced.edu email address from Payroll Services. In order to access that email address, you will first need to *claim* your UC Merced NetID.

You should receive an email subject "Verify your UC Merced ID" that will be sent to the personal email address you provided at your initial intake appointment.

What is UCMNetID?

Your UCMNetID is the account name associated with you and the first part of your UC Merced email address (e.g., if your email address is rbobcat@ucmerced.edu, then your UCMNetID is rbobcat). You'll use your UCMNetID to access UC Merced services like email, CatCourses, Box, Zoom, your Degree Audit, your financial account, and much more. Sign in at the top of this page to access your UCMNetID account, where you can manage your specific contact, access, and security details.


If you don't have your email "Verify your UC Merced ID" you can go directly to the website to claim your ID following the steps outlined below.

2-Factor Authentication Enrollment Guide

Duo adds a second layer of security to our sign-on process that greatly decreases the risks posed by phishing, social engineering, password brute-force attacks, and attackers exploiting weak or stolen credentials.

The two factors in 2-Factor Authentication are your password (something you know), and a device of your choosing (something you have).

With two-factor authentication, even if someone manages to get your password and tries to log in, Duo will notify you and you can deny them access to your account.



Before you get started, you will need the following:

- Your computer
- Your UCMNetId and password
- Your 2FA device of choice (Duo Mobile, Phone Number or Security Key)
 - OIT highly recommends the use of your mobile device (Duo Mobile or Phone Number) as your first and primary 2FA method.
- The Duo Mobile app downloaded (available in Apple and Google Play App Stores) to speed up the enrollment process.
